More than 45% of families in struggle to afford basic needs including food, housing and health care. Four out of every ten households in Fremont, Teton, Madison, Jefferson, Boneville, Clark, Butte, Custer, and Lemhi counties are forced to make impossible decisions.

Should I buy groceries and diapers, or pay my rent?

Should I fix my car today, or risk it breaking down on the way to work?

How long can I put off my necessary medical care that I can't afford?

We awarded over \$400,000 in community grant funds to local organizations focused on urgent needs like food access and housing.

More than 106,123 meals were provided through programs designed to support ALICE Seniors in our community.
